Seminars target groups

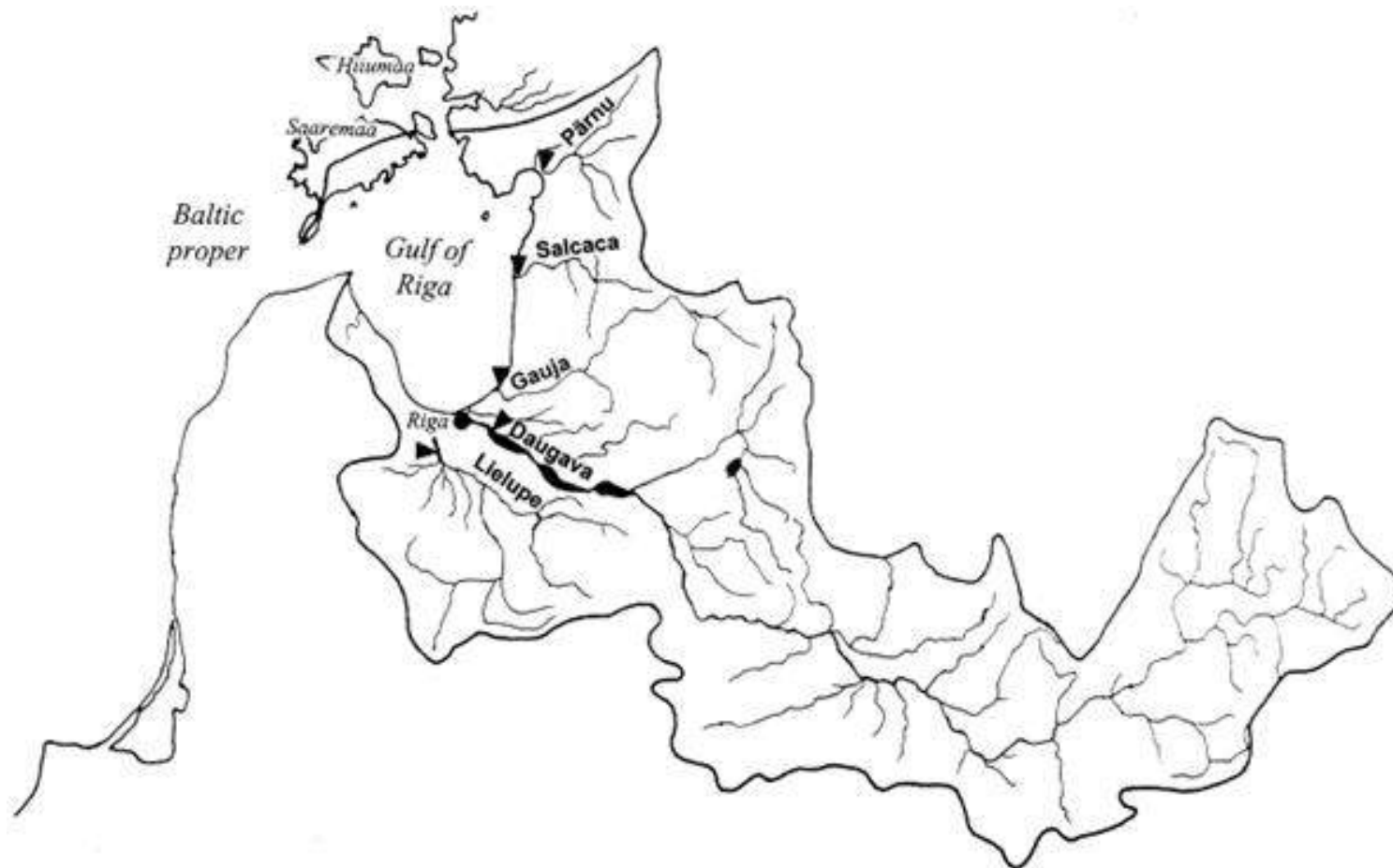
- Participants of seminars – two target groups with different levels of knowledge (Basic and advanced level).

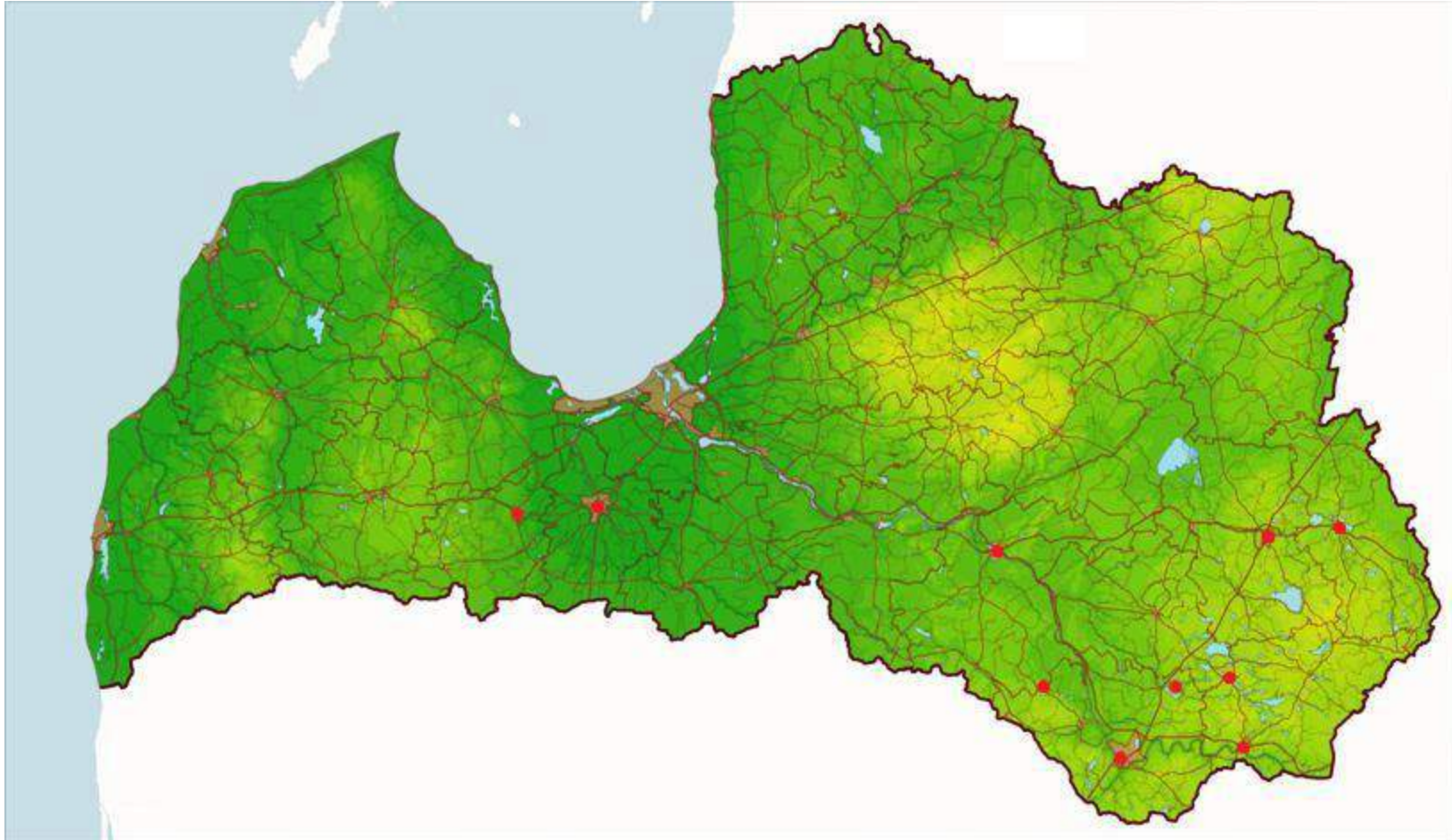

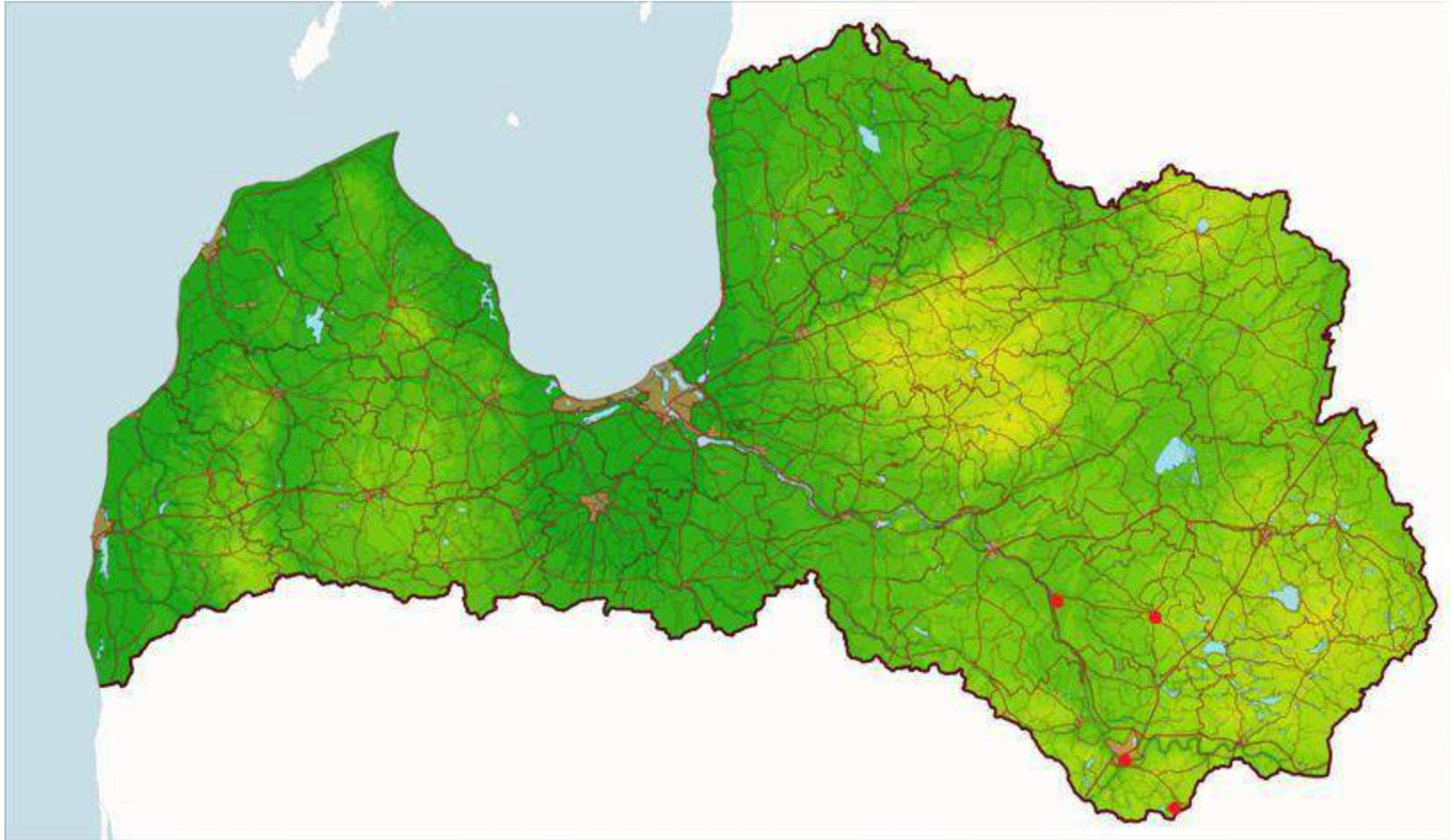

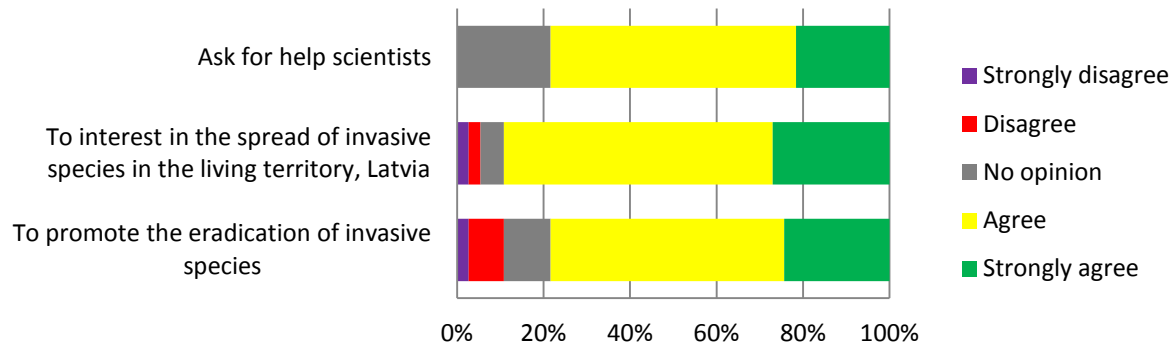

 - September 11-12, 2014 in Daugavpils (33 participants)

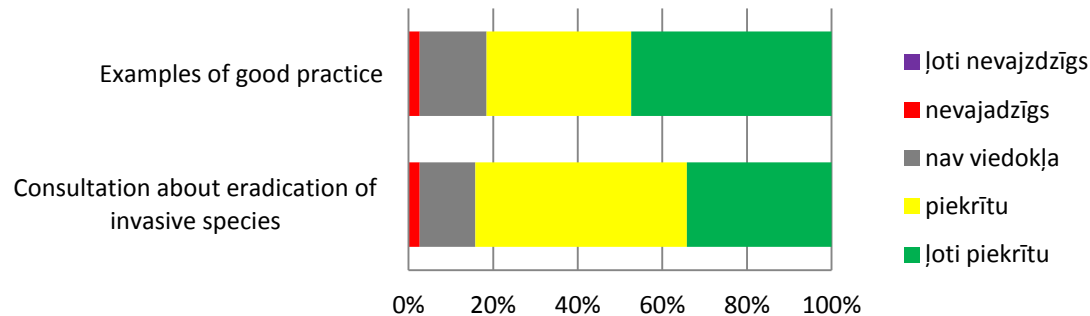


RESULTS OF QUESTIONNAIRES
